INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this circular is to give you the information regarding the resolutions to be proposed at the 2017 AGM relating to the above matters and the notice of the 2017 AGM.

ISSUE MANDATE

In order to ensure flexibility and give discretion to the Directors, in the event that it becomes desirable for the Company to issue any new Shares, approval is to be sought from the Shareholders, pursuant to the Listing Rules, for the Issue Mandate to issue Shares. At the 2017 AGM, an ordinary resolution will be proposed to grant the Issue Mandate to the Directors. Based on 800,000,000 Shares in issue as at the Latest Practicable Date and assuming that no further Shares will be issued or no Shares will be repurchased and cancelled after the Latest Practicable Date and up to the date of the 2017 AGM, the Directors will be able to allot, issue and deal with up to a total of 160,000,000 Shares, being 20% of the total number of the issued Shares as at the date of the resolution in relation thereto if the Issue Mandate is granted at the 2017 AGM, which will remain in effect until the earliest of (i) the conclusion of the next annual general meeting; (ii) the expiration of the period within which the next annual general meeting is required to be held by the Articles of Association or any applicable laws of the Cayman Islands; or (iii) the date on which such authority is revoked or varied by an ordinary resolution of the Shareholders at general meeting of the Company.

REPURCHASE MANDATE

RE-ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

As at the Latest Practicable Date, there were two executive Directors, namely Mr. Neil David Howard and Mr. Steven Paul Smithers; and three INEDs, namely Mr. Richard Gareth Williams, Mr. Robert Peter Andrews and Mr. Lap Shek Eddie Wong.

Article 108(a) of the Articles of Association provides that one-third of the Directors for the time being, or, if their number is not a multiple of three, the number nearest to but not less than one-third shall retire from office by rotation at each annual general meeting provided that every Director shall be subject to retirement by rotation at least once every three years and shall be eligible for re-election. A proxy need not be a Member but must be present in person at the 2017 AGM to represent the Member. If more than one proxy is so appointed, the appointment shall specify the number and class of such Shares in respect of which such proxy is so appointed.
2. In order to be valid, the duly completed and signed form of proxy must be deposited together with a power of attorney or other authority, if any, under which it is signed or a notarially certified copy of that power or authority, at the office of the Company’s branch share registrar and transfer office in Hong Kong, Tricor Investor Services Limited located at Level 22, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen’s Road East, Hong Kong not later than 48 hours before the time appointed for holding the 2017 AGM or its adjourned meeting. Completion and return of a form of proxy will not preclude a Member from subsequently attending in person and voting at the 2017 AGM or its adjourned meeting should he/she so wish.
3. For determining the Members’ entitlement to attend and vote at the 2017 AGM, the register of Members will be closed from Tuesday, 19 September 2017 to Friday, 22 September 2017 (both dates inclusive), during which period no transfer of Shares will be effected. In order to qualify for attending and voting at the 2017 AGM, all transfer documents, accompanied by the relevant share certificates, must be lodged with the Company’s Hong Kong branch share registrar and transfer office, Tricor Investor Services Limited located at Level 22, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen’s Road East, Hong Kong for registration not later than 4:30 p.m. on Monday, 18 September 2017.
4. Subject to the approval of the Members at the 2017 AGM, the proposed final dividend will be payable on or about Wednesday, 18 October 2017 to the Members whose names appear on the register of Members of the Company on Friday, 6 October 2017. To ascertain the entitlement of the Members to the proposed final dividend, the register of Members of the Company will be closed from Tuesday, 3 October 2017 to Friday, 6 October 2017, both days inclusive, during which period no transfer of Shares will be registered by the Company. In order to qualify for the proposed final dividend, all duly completed transfer forms accompanied

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by the relevant share certificates must be lodged with the Company's Hong Kong branch share registrar, Tricor Investor Services Limited at Level 22, Hopewell Centre, 183 Queen's Road East, Hong Kong, not later than 4:30 p.m. on Friday, 29 September 2017.

5. In relation to the proposed resolution no. 2 above, details of the retiring Directors standing for re-election are set out in Appendix I to the circular (the "**Circular**") of the Company dated 28 July 2017.
6. In relation to the proposed resolution no. 5 above, the Board concurs with the views of the audit committee of the Company and has recommended that BDO Limited be re-appointed independent auditor of the Company.
7. In relation to the proposed resolutions nos. 6 and 8 above, approval is being sought from the Members for the grant to the Directors of a general mandate to authorise the allotment and issue of Shares under the Listing Rules. The Directors have no immediate plans to issue any new Shares.
8. In relation to the proposed resolution no. 7 above, the Directors wish to state that they will exercise the powers conferred thereby to repurchase Shares only in the circumstances which they consider appropriate for the benefit of the Members. An explanatory statement containing the information necessary to enable the Members to make an informed decision to vote on the proposed resolution as required by the Listing Rules is set out in Appendix II to the Circular.
9. In compliance with Rule 13.39(4) of the Listing Rules, voting on all proposed resolutions set out in this Notice will be decided by way of a poll.

 - (a) Subject to paragraph (b) below, if a tropical cyclone warning signal No. 8 or above is expected to be hoisted or a black rainstorm warning signal is expected to be in force at any time between 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. on the date of the 2017 AGM, the 2017 AGM will be postponed and Members will be informed of the date, time and venue of the postponed 2017 AGM by a supplemental notice posted on the respective websites of the Company and the Stock Exchange.
 - (b) If a tropical cyclone warning signal No. 8 or above or a black rainstorm warning signal is lowered or cancelled three hours or more before the appointed time of the 2017 AGM and where conditions permit, the 2017 AGM will be held as scheduled.
 - (c) The 2017 AGM will be held as scheduled when an amber or red rainstorm warning signal is in force.
 - (d) After considering their own situations, Members should decide on their own whether or not they would attend the 2017 AGM under any bad weather condition and if they do so, they are advised to exercise care and caution.
